The Buckeye Ranch and Nationwide Children's Hospital Partner on New Mental Health Facility for Youth

Pediatric mental health experts collaborate to enhance community-based care for youth

Grove City, Ohio, January 10, 2023 — As the youth mental health crisis continues to grow in the region and across the nation, <u>The Buckeye Ranch</u> and <u>Nationwide Children's Hospital</u> are collaborating to address the need for higher acuity care for youth and families with a new 48-bed residential mental health treatment facility.

This collaboration will reimagine The Buckeye Ranch's current facilities, creating optimal residential treatment programs to bridge inpatient psychiatric treatment for youth with especially challenging needs. The state-of-the-art facility, expected to break ground in spring 2023, will mainly serve youth who are transitioning from hospital settings, but who need to continue their recovery process and maintain stability before returning to their homes. With more than 57,000 square feet, the building at The Buckeye Ranch will include a new education center, up-to-date space for intensive treatment, and a welcome center – all allowing for greater family engagement, involvement and visitation. Overall, the facility will provide families with additional access to residential treatment and more intensive help for youth with serious emotional and behavioral health concerns. The expansion will be funded through a combination of operations and community philanthropy. Fundraising efforts to support the project are underway.

"Mental illness is one of the most pressing health issues of our time, and it has been exacerbated with the isolation and the stressors associated with the pandemic," said Vickie Thompson-Sandy, CEO and President of The Buckeye Ranch. "One in five U.S. children experience a mental health condition in a given year, and locally, one Ohioan under 18 years dies by suicide every 33 hours. The Buckeye Ranch, working with Nationwide Children's Hospital, is fortunately in the position to expand our expertise and facilities to serve these youth and promote healing."

The Buckeye Ranch's commitment to children and adolescent mental and behavioral health goes back more than six decades, and Nationwide Children's Hospital is recognized as one of the nation's largest and most respected providers of mental and behavioral health services for children and youth. Their long-standing relationship has provided services to meet youth and families' unique physical, mental and behavioral health needs, but the region still faces a gap in the continuum of care for youth with complex mental health conditions.

This facility will benefit by collaboration between the mental and behavioral health experts at both organizations and providers throughout the community on a variety of needs including training and hiring strategies to enhanced quality and safety.

"As providers, we strive to meet patients and families where they are with the resources they need to thrive. A single provider cannot meet the needs of an entire community alone. We proactively seek out partnerships throughout the community that will enhance vital services for children's mental health, and we are excited about this collaboration with The Buckeye Ranch, as they maintain an outstanding reputation for residential care," said David Axelson, MD, Chief of the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Health at Nationwide Children's Hospital. "This new facility will benefit our patients, and children cared for providers throughout the community. This is a positive and proactive step forward in our community-based model for mental health care."

"These changes will help us modernize mental health treatment, implementing a holistic, innovative, and coordinated approach to the continuum of care that was not achievable in our previous facilities," said Sarah Book, Vice President of Residential Services at The Buckeye Ranch. "Our goal is to help youth and their families navigate a severe mental health crisis and put into place the resources needed to promote further healing beyond an inpatient stay and prepare youth for a safe return to their communities."
